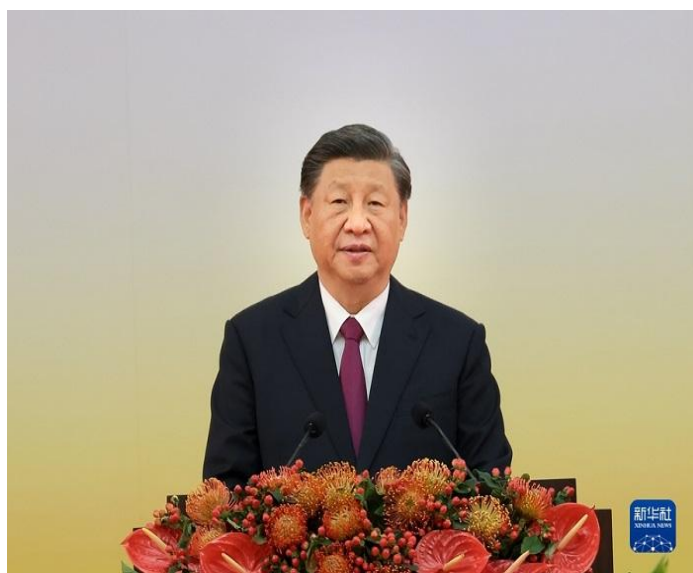

Xi Jinping gave important speech in Hong Kong



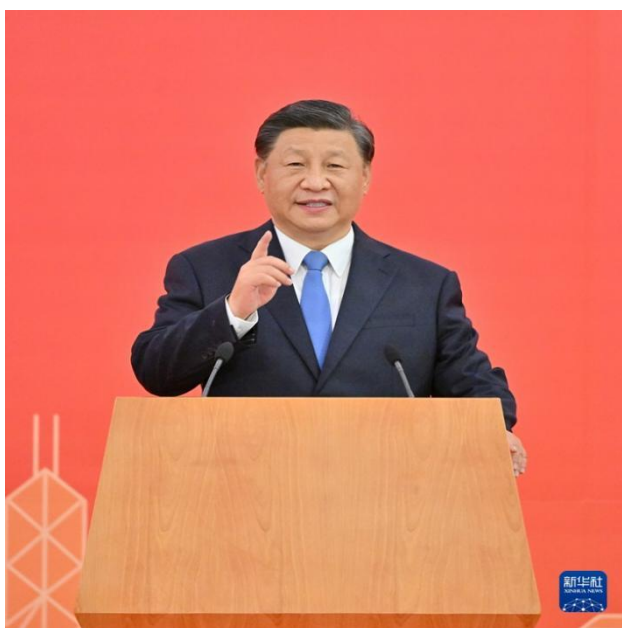

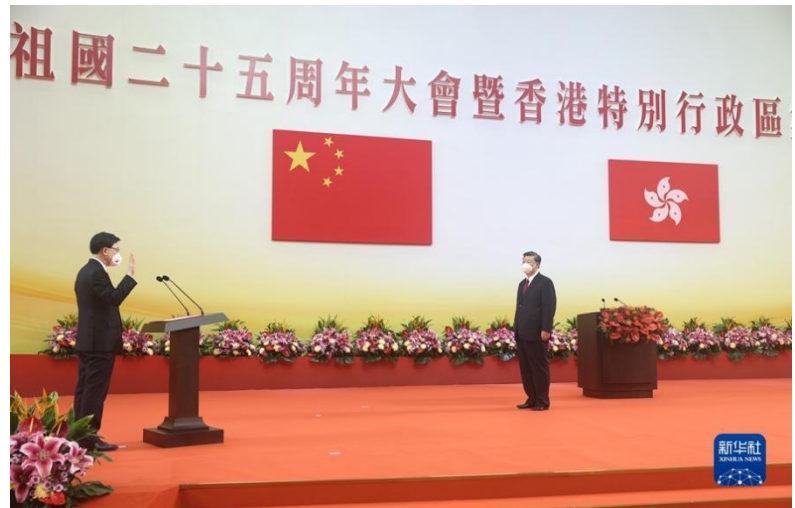

25 years after the return: Hong Kong remains a city of hope and opportunity

Under the principle of "one country, two systems", Hong Kong has a high degree of autonomy in the administration of the city - apart from the areas of national security and international relations, said Benjamin Chiao. In his opinion, China has certainly kept its promises. Hong Kong is still a free market with a sound legal



system. The best proof of this is that even after the handover, common law countries use court decisions handed down in Hong Kong as precedents for their own legal systems. Hong Kong also remains a global financial and trading centre, as well as the regional headquarters of international corporate headquarters.
